1. DANIEL¹ NEW died September 19, 1745 in Padworth, Berks. He married MARY NAPPER March 01, 1739/40 in Padworth, Berks.

2. EDWARD² NEW (*DANIEL*¹) was born March 22, 1740/41 in Padworth, Berks, and died March 13, 1796 in Aldermaston, Berks. He married SARAH HIND December 19, 1779. She was born Abt. 1750, and died February 25, 1830 in Aldermaston, Berks.

Generation No. 3

3. DANIEL³ NEW (*EDWARD*², *DANIEL*¹) was born 1789 in Aldermaston, Berks, and died 1865. He married (1) MARY BROWN. She died 1851. He married (2) MARY HARRIS October 04, 1852 in Newbury, daughter of RICHARD HARRIS and SARAH JENNINGS. She was born February 24, 1827, and died 1859.

Notes for DANIEL NEW:

Sarah Jane was born at Woolhampton on 2nd June 1857. Her mother, Mary, was the second wife of Daniel New. His first marriage, in 1813, was to Mary Brown (no relation to our family of Browns as far as I can tell), who died in 1851 when Daniel (born in 1789) had just turned 62. Daniel remarried the following year. His new wife, Mary Higgs, just 25 years old, was herself widowed. Her maiden name was Harris. She had a half sister, Charlotte, 16 years older and the wife of Edward Gray, a cowman of Woolhampton, who is the top-hatted chap seen with Sarah Jane and her older brother Edward in the photograph taken on Woolhampton Bridge circa 1862 (boys under the age of about 10 commonly wore skirts in those days) .

Mary died in 1859, just a couple of weeks before Sarah Jane's second birthday. The photograph of Mary holding Sarah Jane on her lap must therefore have been taken some time before mid-May of 1859.

Edward Gray died in 1861 and his widow, Mary's half-sister Charlotte, was married to Daniel New in Newbury on 4th August 1862. Daniel was then 72 and he lived for only another 3 years. Sarah Jane was therefore brought up by a stepmother who was also her aunt.

First wife of Daniel New. She dies when he was 62

Notes for MARY HARRIS:

Her first husband was named Higgs. She was widowed

She was the 2nd of 3 wives for Daniel New. She was 25 and he was 63 when they married.

His half sister was Charlotte Harris, 16 years older than her. When Mary Harris died, her sister Charlotte married Daniel New when he was 72 in Newbury on August 4, 1862.

4. SARAH JANE⁴ NEW (*DANIEL*³, *EDWARD*², *DANIEL*¹) was born June 02, 1858 in Woolhampton Berkshire, UK, and died Abt. 1950. She married WILLIAM BROWN December 26, 1879 in Newbury Primitive Methodist Chapel, son of WILLIAM BROWN. He was born April 27, 1852 in Woolhampton, Berkshire, UK, and died June 15, 1916 in Hurst, Berks, UK.

Notes for SARAH JANE NEW:

Emigrated to Canada in 1920s. Lived with Winnifred for a few years.

Returned to England in 1929

Sarah Jane was born at Woolhampton on 2nd June 1857. Her mother, Mary, was the second wife of Daniel New. His first marriage, in 1813, was to Mary Brown (no relation to our family of Browns as far as I can tell), who died in 1851 when Daniel (born in 1789) had just turned 62. Worked as a farm hand and harvesting in Alberta in the fall. Moved later to Pioneer Lodge, Assiniboia
